Abstract

Previous to 1930, Columbia House was not considered within the city limits and was difficult to track down on census records. Title deeds listed it in 1924 for \$3000 (2024's equivalent to \$54000). It was not included in city fire maps, as it was just outside the lines drawn for fire codes. Supposedly the house has been standing since 1914, but this can not be verified through Title Deeds, City Directories, and blueprints could not be found. **The Tuckers** were the first owners of this address and had four children and raised their nephews before the house foreclosed in 1935. It remained vacant for a year before Stanley and Naomi **Roeder** lived there. Stanley served in the armed forces, they had now known children, but witnessed several late night weddings. In 1940 **the Rapers** resided at Columbia House, having met the previous decade boarding together. Unfortunately, Mr. Raper was caught committing adultrey and Mrs. Raper won the house and all belongings as noted in the Title Deed. In 1946, **The Headlees** bought Columbia house and Walter moved in with his wife, children, and mother-in-law. From this point on until 2001, Columbia House passed on through four generations. Walter's son lived there for two years and then his daughter Dorothy and her husband Raymond **Dewitt** took over in 1975 and their children took it over after them through the 2000s.

4. Tucker Family (1926-1935)

Stanley Roeder, Naomi, and her sister Viola Reynolds actually served as witnesses in a few courthouse weddings.

Richard Raper was born in 1893 in Indiana to Ransom Wallace and Lena Raper. In his 1919 Draft Card he is listed as residing in Urbana, IL. He married Ida Guthrie in 1930. Ida Guthrie was a cook for various industries around town. In 1940 they're recorded as living in this house with their son, Donald. Richard was a laborer for the university. In 1945, according to the house deeds, it appears that Mr. Raper committed adultery and Ida filed for divorce, becoming the sole owner of 1310 W. Columbia.

19. Headlee Family (1946-1971)

In 1946, the Champaign City Directory has Walter S Headlee residing here. He was married to Ruby I. and her mother, Martha (Belle) McNeeley lived here as well. They lived here from 1946 until 1971 according to Census records and City Directories. Walter worked as a painter and upholsterer. In the basement, over 30 glass bottles for tablets, capsules, and tonics to a Mrs. W. P. McNeely, prescribed by Dr. Christie - of Christie Clinic. In 1920 they lived with their daughter in Willow Branch Twsp IL. Their daughter, Dorothy married Raymond in 1930 and they had a son and daughter named Thomas and Peggy Dewitt.

1924-1934

Quite the socialites, all members of the Tucker family made headlines in local newspapers. Ezra Tucker was carpenter, while his wife was musically inclined. Like many, they lost the house in 1928.

Tucker Family

In 1913 Maude Buzzard almost drowned with a friend in a lake. In 1920 she did an advertisement for a "Dr. Pierce Favourite Prescription". Ezra Tucker was from Kentucky and Maude came from Fayette Co. IL. They moved to Champaign in 1924 with their children Helen, Jessie, Claude, and Paul. Also in 1924 Claude Tucker went with the scouts to Turkey Run and then next year he won an award. In 1926 they moved to this residence with their nephews Mike and Fritz. That same year, Helen Tucker was chairman of the bowling committee. The next year Paul and Claude helped make repairs at the local scout camp. Maude and her sister were involved in local music groups and President of the Ladies Auxiliary of Carpenters. In 1928 the Buzzard brothers were discharged from the Cunningham Children's home to live with the Tuckers. Helen Tucker, who graduated in 1931 and was prominent in music and dramatics while attending the University, continued to be involved in community events and was in many theater productions as reported in the Daily Illini. The house deeds list that possibly the Tuckers came into some financial trouble in 1928 as they are trying to secure money on their loan. In the 1930 Census, she was registered as living in Chicago as a Bookkeeper. In 1933, there was a Quit Claim Deed made out to Ann Gallagher. By 1935 they had fallen into foreclosure on the house.

In 1940 Ezra Tucker was residing in Hardin County, Kentucky, remarried to Ada Harvey with children while Maude lived at 1212 W. Park St in Champaign with Jessie, Claude, Fritz and Mike. Maude is listed as having been divorced and Ezra lists Helen as his contact on his WW2 draft card.

NORMAL STUDENTS IN ACCIDENT

-Armor Pitman, of Bridgeport, III. and Miss Maude Huzzard, of Summer III., narrowly escaped being the principals in a double drawning accident Wednesday at Miller park when, in attempting to change seats in a bout in which they were rowing, the boat averturned, throwing them both into the deepest part of the new lake. But for Pitman's presence of mind and action by others who were rowing nearby the story might have been of two deaths by drowning. The young people are summer school students at Normal.

How Accident Happened.

Pitman and Miss Buzzard were rowing in a steel boat having sin the bottom air chambers. It is nearly impossible to sink one of these boats and even when it is filled with water it will support five people in the water. They were just to the south of the bridge between the two links when they decided to change seets.

As they were passing such other the boat tipped, filled with water, and the roung reciple were thrown into the lake. Pitman held the boat with one hand and held files Buzaard about the waist with the other. Just at this point Mr. Leslie Stone and Miss shaty Ulbrich, who were rowing near by, assisted in the rescuing work taking Pitman into their boat, while Miss Buzzard was picked up by people in another boat.



Phillips

Ray Phillips Roomed here in 1939 as recorded in the City Directories. It's hard to track him down as that's all there is to go on. A couple of Ray Phillips are recorded in Census records and newspapers, but it's difficult to tell if they are one and the same. There was a Ray Phillips who previously lived in Urbana. His wife died in 1904 and he fell on hard times, being arrested for bootlegging on several occasions. But it appears he passed in 1914. In the 1940s, Ray Phillips appeared to play for the hockey team and scored fairly well. The other notices of Ray Phillips were of a man who lived with his wife in Northern Illinois in Genoa and I doubt it is this gentleman.


